Iowa Voters See PBM Reform as a Priority

The following are results from a poll conducted by Morning Consult between December 10-December 15, 2024, among a sample of 420 Iowa Registered Voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Iowa Registered Voters based on gender by age, educational attainment, race, marital status, home ownership, race by educational attainment, and 2020 presidential vote. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 5 percentage points.

80 percent of Iowa voters agree it is important that the state legislature take action to address concerns related to PBMs.
